

High Fidelity Wraparound Process

Family Resources conducts the High Fidelity Wraparound Process in partnership with the Allegheny County Joint Planning Teams.

The High Fidelity Wraparound Process supports children with a mental health diagnosis who are involved in multiple systems. Wraparound facilitators address the unique needs of the child and their family by developing an individualized plan of care. Here, our goal is to enable the child to remain safely in their home and community with appropriate support and resources.

What to expect from services:

Engagement and team preparation — staff meet with clients to discuss the wraparound process and listen to each family’s story. Together the staff and client discuss concerns, strengths, hopes and vision for the future. The Wraparound staff assists each family to identify their natural supports such as family members and friends.

Initial plan development — Each family attends the first Wraparound meeting with the Wraparound Team and the natural supports the family has selected to be there. The team will develop a plan to include each family’s goals, assess their needs, and build on their strengths to find ways to meet those goals.

Plan implementation — based on each planning meeting, the Wraparound team will write an individualized plan of care. Each team member will commit to action steps and agree to meet on a consistent basis.

Transition — even though transitions happen throughout the process, there will be a point when the families no longer need to meet regularly with their Wraparound team. At this time an individualized plan of care for the future will be developed, including who to call if further assistance is needed by the Wraparound team.

Eligibility

The family must be a resident of Allegheny County and have a child who:

- Is between the ages of 5-21 years old
- Is eligible for Medical Assistance
- Has a mental health diagnosis
- Is at risk for hospitalization or other out of home placement
- Has complex service coordination needs
- Is involved in multiple systems (special education, juvenile justice, and mental health for example)

The following are the guiding principles for High Fidelity Wraparound:

- Family voice and choice
- Team-based
- Natural supports
- Collaboration
- Community-based
- Culturally competent
- Individualized
- Strength-based
- Unconditional care
- Outcome-based
